Website Upgrade



D'Aguilar National Park

The Head Road over Teviot Range is currently closed from about 5 km before the junction with Carneys Creek Road. This affects access to sections of the Main Range NP. Southern access to the following locations will be affected-Lizard South remote bush camp and at Mount Superbus, both North and South Peak remote bush camps

Enoggera Reservoir


Be aware of nesting eel tail catfish - They may become aggressive in shallow water including the designated swimming area.

Volunteering opportunities with the QPWS



Why bushwalkers need clean boots

A recent <u>ABC article</u> documents the need to arrive and leave the bush with clean boots as a way of combating the spread of Phytophora dieback. This disease threatens entire groves of grass trees and banksias in a short space of time. These plants provide a habitat for a number of small animals such as potoroos and pygmy possums, the death of these plants reduces shelter options for these species, increasing their vulnerability to predators.

In order to reduce the spread of disease and pathogens when bushwalking, good practice dictates the following:

Clean footwear and equipment before you visit

Use boot-washing stations to clean footwear and equipment (such as walking poles) when going in and out of the forest


Avoid going off designated walking tracks, and do not enter areas affected by closures

Never assume anywhere is disease free

Keep a spare set of shoes and a cleaning kit in your vehicle

Purchase gear that is easy to clean.

If you come across <u>a boot washing station</u> that is not functioning properly please report this to <u>Queensland Parks and Forests.</u>
