Why are we doing this? The current website is written in Drupal 7, and support for this is expiring and upgrading requires a total re-write of the site.

Change to Walk Grading Definition

The Committee has discussed the following change to the definition of the Fitness and Endurance **Grading "F":**

Old definition of F: Extreme - Very high fitness, endurance and agility required. About twelve hours of walking and greater than **1000m** of elevation gain/loss per day.

New Definition of F: Extreme - Very high fitness, endurance and agility required. About twelve hours of walking and greater than **1400m** of elevation gain/loss per day.

This distinguishes level F more clearly from the current level E, which is also 1000m, but with other differences:

Most of the "E" and "F "graded walks are in the Mt Barney region.


Our Gratitude to:

Track Closures

Bushwalkers please note: with the current unstable weather

conditions, providing accurate track closure information is extremely difficult. Please refer to the links below for the most accurate up to date information on track conditions.

Main Range National Park

Mt Mitchell Track - track still open, just temporarily realigned to 31 July Northern Cunningham's Gap walking tracks - still open with ongoing works to 16 January

Lamington National Park

Annual closure for all bush camps including Gold Coast Hinterland Great Walk to 31 January

Bellthorpe National Park

Some areas in Bellthorpe National Park are closed until declared safe. Closed areas include Branch Creek and Beacon Road closure effective 2 January - 2 February.

D'Aguilar National Park

Eel Tailed Catfish Nesting Season - caution when swimming - Walkabout Creek Discovery Centre to 31 January

Bunya Conservation Park - Car park 1 and toilet block closed to 30 September Camp Mountain Access Road - closed due to a landslip to 2 April Mt Mee - Mill Rainforest Walking Track closed due to storm damage to 30 September


SEQ Beaches

Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service is warning visitors of the potential dangers posed by toxic canisters washing up on Queensland beaches. National Parks affected include K'gari and Southern Moreton Bay Islands and Cooloola Recreation Area. Canisters should not be moved or opened, and any sightings should be reported to emergency services on Triple Zero (000).







Citizen Science Projects


Wild Yeast Zoo

Researchers at the University of Newcastle have developed a project to unlock the potential of unexplored Australian Yeast. They will be looking at how wild yeasts can be used for new yeast beers as well as how wild yeasts can be used for other applications such as biotechnology, medicine, or food production. This is a Citizen Science Project where the public can assist in the collection of wild yeasts from the environment. iNaturalist

"iNaturalist helps you identify the plants and animals around you while generating data for science and conservation. What's more, by recording and sharing your observations, you'll create research-quality data for scientists working to better understand and protect nature. Every observation can contribute to biodiversity science, from the rarest butterfly to the most common backyard weed. We share your findings with scientific data repositories like the Global Biodiversity Information Facility to help scientists find and use your data. All you have to do is observe."
